We are pleased to announce the convening of the **2nd Cyber Intelligence Summit 2026**, titled "Information as Defense: From Everyday Practice to Global Strategy", scheduled to take place on **Thursday, February 5, 2026**, from **9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.**, at the **Athens Concert Hall (Megaron Mousikis Athinon)** and is currently held under the auspices of the Ministry of National Defence of Greece, the Ministry of Digital Governance of Greece, the Ministry of Defense of Cyprus and the Deputy Ministry of Research, Innovation and Digital Policy of Cyprus.
